This policy demonstrates the Company's commitment to supporting a positive work-life balance by providing two weeks of paid leave at 100% of regular weekly pay for an eligible employee to assist with family care in the event of the birth or adoption of a child. An employed mother giving birth will receive two weeks of Paid Parental Leave in addition to the six to eight weeks of paid medical disability under Short-Term Disability. PVZ BUILDING SOLAR PANEL INSTALLATION PROJECT

In today's environmentally conscious world, many businesses are increasingly looking for ways to reduce their environmental impact while lowering their operational costs. Sandmeyer Steel Company has recently committed to this goal with an exciting plan to install solar panels on the PVZ Building roof. The project officially kicked off last summer with the removal of the existing roof and the installation of a new roofing system capable of supporting over 700 solar panels and all the associated racks, hardware, and electrical components. The new roof installation was completed in October of last year, and the solar panel portion of the project is expected to begin in early 2025.

WHY GO SOLAR?

Solar energy is a renewable and sustainable source of power that can offer significant benefits to our Company. The most immediate benefit of installing solar panels will be the reduction of our electricity costs. By generating a portion of our own electricity, we will be able to reduce our reliance on utility companies while becoming less vulnerable to price fluctuations. As energy prices continue to rise, securing a reliable and cost-effective energy source through solar panels is a smart business strategy that is sure to offer long-term cost savings.

And although our new solar panel system is not designed to provide for all our electrical consumption, the manufacturer estimates that it will account for almost 25% of our electrical needs. A significant savings to be sure!

EMPLOYEE POTLUCK I UNCHFON

In December last year, employees at Sandmeyer Steel Company worked together to create another potluck luncheon for all. The menu featured rice, chicken curry, meatballs, macaroni and cheese, mixed vegetables, and more. The buffet was topped off with a variety of desserts, including chocolate chip cookies, banana pudding, and cakes.



Also, solar energy is a clean, renewable source that does not contribute to air pollution or greenhouse gas emissions. By supplementing our electrical needs with renewable solar energy, we will be able to reduce our carbon footprint while also demonstrating our commitment to environmental sustainability. Truly a win-win for our Company and for our community.

WHAT'S NEXT?

Our solar panel contractor, Lucent Energy Management, will be working at the PVZ Building over the next several months to complete the installation. Once complete, we will spend some time evaluating the new system and taking a close look at our energy use and savings. And if all goes well, we may install a similar system at our Main Building later in the year offering even greater opportunities for cost savings and environmental sustainability.
